He not only posts about himself and what he is up to but he also interacts with fans, unlike a lot of celebrities on twitter.

The fourth artifact is the YouTube channel of an acapella group named Straight No Chaser. It can be found at <http://www.youtube.com/user/sncmusic>. They are not all that well known to the mainstream media but millions of people have heard of them.
